

LATN/GREK/LING 4150/6150: Comparative Grammar of Greek and Latin
Fall 2006

Objective: To teach selected (!!!!) aspects of the comparative and historical grammars of Greek and Latin, focusing in particular upon their phonological development from Proto-Indo-European.

Format: Lecture with associated readings for reference.

Prerequisite: Prior study of Greek and/or Latin (it is simply in the nature of things that those who have not had both languages will not get as much out of the course as those who have; but study of only one of the languages is not in and of itself a hindrance to performing well in this course).
