About the texts:

Caesar, Invasion of Britain: Adapted from Caesar's *De Bello Gallico*, this graded reader provides a vivid and engrossing account of the campaigns that played a critical role in the histories of both Rome and Britain. The book includes an introduction covering Caesar's involvement in Britain, maps, illustrations, exercises, notes, vocabulary, and index.

Love and Transformation, An Ovid Reader: Introduces students to the timeless artistry of Ovid's *Metamorphoses* and *Amores*.

In the first half of the course Julius Caesar's account of his invasion of Britain will be read in a simplified version. Grammar and syntax will be reviewed as needed and students will continue to increase their vocabulary.

In the second half selections from Ovid will be read un-simplified, but with help provided by the editor of the text.
