Course Description:

Latin 2001 is the third course in the regular sequence of elementary and intermediate Latin. Students will translate continuous Latin passages through readings from Caesar's narrative of his invasion of Britain and Ovid's *Metamorphoses*. Students will make a systematic review of Latin grammar and syntax as they read.
