Course Description: Latin 2001 is the third course in the elementary / intermediate sequence of Latin courses at UGA. In this course we will read selections from prose authors of the late Republic and from Ovid's *Metamorphoses*. The primary goal of this course is to improve your language skills: you will be asked to translate the assignments, parse words, and explain grammatical constructions. However, we will also discuss our readings in terms of their content and the literary genres to which they belong.
