**Course Description:** Latin 2002 is the fourth course in the regular sequence of elementary and intermediate Latin. Proficiency in Latin grammar and syntax is assumed. Students will gain proficiency, facility, and speed by reading original Latin texts, both prose and poetry, while gaining an appreciation of two of Rome's finest stylists.

**Required Texts:**

Cicero, *In Catilinam I & II*. Ed. with intro., notes, and vocab. by H. E. Gould and J. L. Whiteley. London: Bristol Classical Press, 1982.  
Virgil, *Aeneid I-VI*. Ed. with intro and notes by R. D. Williams. London: Bristol Classical Press, 1996.
